Parents are responsible for learning of weather-related early dismissals; students and staff will not be calling from school to notify parents, except in special circumstances. ADVANCE NOTICE: We will again be requesting pre-registration payments for the 2022-2023 school year for students who will be entering Kinder Kids, 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, and 5th grades. The purpose of this pre-registration payment is to better determine the class sizes and staff needs for the coming year. A \$300 fee for each student will be due by April 1, 2022 to secure a place in these classrooms. School parents of students in these grades will receive an email soon from our Finance Committee with more information.



MAP TESTING

will take place January 17-21 for students in 3rd-8th grades. MAP stands for Measures of Academic Progress. It is a testing platform that has been around for twenty years, which, as the title indicates, measures students' academic progress. This has replaced the ITBS (Iowa Test of Basic Skills) test, as this test was phased out in order to phase in the ISASP (Iowa Statewide Assessment of Student Progress). Both the ITBS and ISASP are once-a-year tests that track progress from year to year. Since Oskaloosa Christian had to move away

from ITBS, we looked at alternate testing platforms to see what would give us the best data to assess the progress of our students. MAP testing is an online testing platform that will be given three times a year so we can not only track progress from year-to-year, but also within a school year, allowing data to be shared with parents during both conference times. We ask that you please not schedule appointments, especially during the mornings of January 17-21. It is important that all students are on time and attend for this important testing. Our first MAP testing was held in September and the final testing will be in April.

Below are some test taking tips that can help your child obtain test scores that accurately reflect his or her achievement. Many of these suggestions apply to all kinds of test-taking, not just standardized achievement tests. If your daughter or son is an inexperienced test taker, you may want to talk with her or him about these ideas.

- During the week of testing, make sure you get as much sleep each night as you normally get on a school night.
- Read and listen carefully to the directions for each test while your teacher reads them. Then follow those directions exactly. If you don't understand the directions, ask your teacher to explain them.
- Look at all the answer choices for a question before you select one as your answer. For many test questions, you will need to compare the answer choices and then choose the best one.
- If you are not sure about the correct answer to a test question, first eliminate any choices you know are wrong. Then choose your answer from among the choices that remain.
- When your teacher gives you rest periods between tests, use them to stretch if you feel tired of sitting.
